September means back to school. It is an exciting time for students, teachers, and school administrators. It is also a busy time of year for our fire safety program. The new school year brings new opportunities. It offers a fresh start with new classroom audiences that give me the opportunity to put into operation new ideas and lesson plans. In the coming weeks I will be returning to the schools, introducing myself to new teachers, preparing my fall fire safety schedule, taking inventory and ordering supplies for the upcoming school year.

The North Greece Fire District and Ridge Road Fire District have two new Community Risk Reduction Specialists that they have recently hired. This is our first fall fire prevention season working together. We have been meeting often discussing lesson plans and fall activities. This fall I plan on shadowing them in different classrooms to make our program more cohesive and learn from each other.

The week of September 18-24th is National Child Passenger Safety Week. We are attempting to set up a child passenger safety seat fitting station at the Greece Central School District's Early Learning Center (ELC) on English Road.

The month of October is dedicated to Fire Prevention. This year Fire Prevention week is October 9-15th. The National Fire Protection Association has selected "Cooking Safety Starts with You, Pay Attention to Fire Prevention!" as the 2023 campaign slogan. This emphasizes cooking related fires, which are the leading

cause of fire in the country. The Ridge Road Fire District will be hosting the Town of Grece Memorial Service this year on Sunday, October 8th at 1 pm. Our annual Fire Prevention Week Open House is scheduled for Saturday, October 14th from 10am to 2pm at Greece Athena High School. The town's Fire Service, Monroe Ambulance, Greece Police Department, Greece Central School District, and other community agencies will be present. Another activity for Fire Prevention Week will be our annual "Win a Ride to School on a Fire Truck" contest.
