Updates from the Fire Chief.

FF Bailey Schubmehl and FF Josh Shoemaker have been assigned to day shifts during December to facilitate their training and we are pleased to report they have both been very successful with the help of all four groups. They will be assigned to their respective groups at the first of the year.

Training continues at the former Frears store front. On duty crews have been training in service at this location. A huge thank you to Bryne Dairy for their cooperation in using the property. Ridge Road and North Greece crews have also been on site and the property is offering the opportunity for tactics and fire ground operations at the company level as well as multi company evolutions.

Lt McGarrity and Lt Ballou both completed the Fire Officer II class last month. In addition, Lt McGarrity successfully completed his Instructor Authorization for FF 1 series. We appreciate the extra efforts to complete this off-site training and the time commitment it entails.

Planning and logistics for the April 8^{th} , 2024, eclipse event is ramping up. We will be increasing our duty staffed units that day. More to follow as planning continues locally.

Annual SCBA inspections were completed as well as the cascade. Repairs are being addressed where necessary.

Hurst tool annual inspection and servicing was also completed in November.

All career staff will exceed the required 229 annual minimum training hours. Credit is due to MTO Cappon as well as the officers of all 4 groups for tracking and continually training throughout the year.

A thank you to Comm Norris for his work with AC Dorgan on apparatus maintenance issues. E-223 will be ready to remain in the front line along with E-225 after this week. E-224 will be out of service for an extended period for repairs to the right front corner lower cab area at Hawk Frame and Axle, then 224 will be off to Colden for extensive list of miscellaneous repairs as well as paint work approved under the warranty program.

Captain Johnson is working with 4 of our current Paramedics to review with Dr. Cushman the return of the RSI program.

The station generator did have the new "aftermarket" radiator installed last week and I will have photos of the old radiator for your review at the meeting.

Commissioner Cappon will update you on the recent renovation project. I sat with all 4 groups last week during training and I can report that everyone is very excited at the recent progress and the end is within sight. We appreciate the efforts of Jim Lobene, as he coordinates the final push to completion. Appreciation is also due to Lt Ballou for his continued support of the day-to-day project details that affect operations. And finally, a huge thank you to Sandy for the significant time and effort to track the details of the project and handle the purchasing of the items the district was responsible for such as appliances, window treatments and furnishings. It has been a long journey, but we are only this close to successful completion, from the efforts of our own staff.

Regarding budgets, if approved by the Board tonight the Treasurer will re-allocate funds in the budget to cover accounts that need to be covered. She will e mail the Board members during Christmas week and ask for their approval and then she will make the appropriate changes.

Due to our changes in groups, nine employees will be moving to different groups.

I am pleased to report that as 2023 draws to a close, I will have concluded many of my fall fire safety goals and objectives for the year. I have completed all my classroom presentations for the fall except for Derech HaTorah Academy of Rochester. Derech HaTorah Academy of Rochester has requested that we hold off scheduling our annual presentations until after the holiday season. This past month I concluded our Win A Ride to School on a Fire Truck Contest. During Fire Prevention Week students were asked to make a home fire escape plan and have

a fire drill with their family. One student from each area, Barnard school, was selected as the winner.

This past fall I modified our 1st grade program. In first grade students learn to call 911. This past month I had dispatchers from the Office of Emergency Communication accompany me into the classroom. They were able to answer questions and assisted in role play as we utilized our phone simulator and practiced calling 911.

This fall I have been working closely with the new Community Risk Reduction Specialists from Ridge Road and North Greece Fire Districts. We have been collaborating ideas and lesson plans for our various grade levels.

At the present time I am scheduling and preparing for our winter programs. I typically start preparing for our annual Hazard House program and my second classroom visits. The annual Adopt- A- Hydrant program will go out to our area schools after the holiday break. I will be utilizing the fire district's sign and Facebook page for several safety messages during the holiday and winter seasons.
