The month of March was a busy month. The month began with me assisting the North Greece Fire District teaching CPR programs to the health class students at Greece Arcadia High School. This is a new audience. Until last year, we were unable to reach this grade level due to the block scheduling they have used in middle and high schools. The goal is to expand this program district wide to the other Greece Central middle and high schools.

The Greece Central School Districts participates in a national campaign that promotes reading at the elementary level. The Campaign, "Read Across America" was celebrated in a few ways this past month in our area schools. English Village School hosted a family night/community night on March 7th. I was a guest reader at this event and the department participated in the event staffing a fire truck and a fire safety display. Students from the Greece Central School District's RTE program also assisted with the event. I was invited to be a guest reader at Longridge School and Pinebrook School during the school day for their events.

I was able to complete my second round of classroom presentation for the school year this past month with two days of instruction at Derech HaTorah Academy of Rochester. I am pleased to report that every classroom in our district was visited with a grade specific lesson designed to meet the New York State Learning Standards for that individual grade level. Students in the first and second grade will receive three presentations during the school year. I am in the process of developing a third presentation for the Longridge School fourth grade. Students in fourth grade are learning about electricity in their science unit at this grade level. FF/P Hlebowicz is assisting me with developing a lesson plan that deals with electrical safety.

I have been working with the other fire districts to develop a schedule for the 2025 Hazard House Program. The Hazard House Program starts on April 21st at Northwood School and runs to the end of the school year. We have twenty-two dates and will conclude at Paddy Hill School on June 12th. Students in first, third and fifth grade will participate in the program. Firefighters Hlebowicz, Shoemaker and John Norris will be assisting me with the program this year.
